Definition of a Dartmoor Hill Pony: a pony bred on the commons of Dartmoor by a registered commoner and whose sire and dam run/ran on said commons.

This ensures that the sire has been approved and branded by the Dartmoor Commoners as a suitable stallion to run on the commons.

52. Performance – In Hand. Any age.

53. Performance – RIDDEN, Open to ponies 4 yrs or over, Rider any age.

Test For Performance Ponies In Hand and Ridden:

1. LEAD/RIDE onto the carpet and walk to cone.
2. TURN AND LEAD/RIDE (walk) back to the carpet.
3. HALT with the two FRONT LEGS of the pony on the carpet
4. REVERSE PONY off carpet between cones, then turn and TROT up to the next cone (5)....
5. HALT. Riders dismount and pick up front leg, count aloud to three. Remount. Steward to help.
LEADERS pick up front leg, and count aloud to three.
LEADERS and RIDERS then proceed to 6 at the TROT.
6. RIDERS and LEADERS both TROT over the white pole to X (7)
RIDERS SITTING TROT
LEADERS LEADING FROM THE OFF SIDE
7. From X lead/ride AT A WALK back to the start. Take a 360 degree turn around the pole marked Y (as close as possible to pole)
LEADERS loose Rein on ponies all the way from X to start
Riders only use ONE rein to turn pony around pole,
Two Reins the rest of the time
8. Halt at Start for Judge to inspect tack and turnout.

Please study this test carefully, competitors can walk the course 5 minutes before the class starts.
